
# **1** Sand Hollow Campground

This campground lies less than a ½ mile south of the State Highway 243 – State Highway 26 intersection along the Columbia River shoreline. Technically, it lies on the shore of the Wanapum Dam pool upriver from the dam. There are 40 dry sites (no water/sewer/electricity). However, the recreational area lies in a such a scenic area and if travelers plan ahead, the other attractions on-site will make up for the

lack of amenities. There are trails, sandy beaches, a swimming area, covered picnic areas with tables, wheelchair accessible areas and vault toilets. Tents are recommended but small trailers are permitted assuming they fit into the campsite parking spots. There are fees for camping though the area is open year-round and visitors can reserve campsites for the peak season, March 1 – September 30. The recreational area is owned and managed by the Grant County PUD (Public Utility District).

# **7** Blue Lake Resort




Located 12 miles north of Soap Lake, just north of Lake Lenore and Alkali Lake, and on the south end of Blue Lake, you'll find Blue Lake Resort directly off a curve in the road. This site has been home to the resort since the 1930's, and to the owner since the 1970's.

Here you'll find the tradition of a family-friendly space, with plenty of room for the kids to run and play. The owners are happy to book groups, and the resort offers 12 cabins with a capacity of up to 12 people. Family pets are welcome, with an extra fee.

Once settled, head to the beach for a swim, or take a seat and enjoy the miles of views of the Lower Grand Coulee stretching into the distance north and south. Available for the anglers in the family, is a boat launch for guest use and 12-foot aluminum boats for rent, a couple with motors, and a bait and tackle shop in the on-site grocery store. And for the adventurous types, this resort offers great access to the Lake Lenore Caves and the hiking trails there.

If you're looking for a pull-through for your RV, be sure to reserve one of the four sites early. When considering your reservation, mind the season for this historic resort is open April – October.

# Coulee City Community Campground




This fun campground is situated on a bay at the south end of Coulee City off US Highway 2. It is operated by the city, which is who may be called with any questions, concerns or with group rental requests. Group rentals consist of an "island" of sites, one of many in the campground, and must be made at least a month in advance.

Other than group rentals, sites are on a first come, first serve basis and are paid for at a pay station that takes both credit card and cash. Use of the public boat launch and dump station is an extra fee, for overnight or day use patrons.

The 125 plus sites, are available for RVs or tents. Of those sites, 55 are full hook-up, 20 are pull-through and 70 plus are dry sites with no amenities. The coin-operated showers are in a large facility. The campground is open year-round, although water is not available during the winter months. Pets are allowed though they need to be on-leash at all times, and are not allowed in the swimming, playground or picnic area.

If you're looking for something with a great view on the water at Banks Lake, be sure to follow the gravel road that ventures out on the spit towards the north. You'll find great sites there, lined with trees and the lake on all sides.




Located just off State Highway 17 on Park Lake Road, you'll find the family-friendly Coulee Lodge Resort. Open April through the end of September, this resort is perfect for reaching both Park Lake to the north and Blue Lake to the south.

Its open season corresponds with recreation opportunities of the lakes. If you're looking for excellent trout fishing, head to Blue Lake. More high-paced water sports and recreation may be found at Park Lake. With a fish bait and tackle shop, a rentable pontoon boat equipped with lifejackets, and Sun Lakes State Park only minutes away, it's easy access to whatever day on the lake you are looking for. And, if you're just looking for a place to relax, take a seat on the resort's beach and enjoy the fantastic view.

Many of their 30 AMP full hook-up RV locations and tent sites are situated under trees right at the water's edge. Or, stay in one of their blue and white one- or two-bedroom cabins and park models vacation rentals that couldn't look more at home than at the lake.

Pets are allowed for an extra fee, and showers, toilets, and propane refills are available. Forget an essential? Don't worry, you can pick it up in their grocery store, where there is an abundance of literature on additional regional recreation options, and lots of local knowledge.




Known to many as the Laurent's Sun Valley Resort, this beautiful tucked-away resort is under new ownership! Heading east on Park Lake Road from State Highway 17, you'll find the resort located on the small strip of land between the south end of Park Lake and the north end of Blue Lake. The resort is open from April to the end of September.

Native Americans and early explorers in the region were known to have portaged canoes across this strip of land while traveling in the Grand Coulee. This central location is a great spot to do exploring yourself, so fuel up your boat, rent a canoe, row boat, or motor boat, or hit the trailhead from the resort to the Blue Lake Rhino site, where you can see the fossilized impression of a rhinoceros who was caught in the ancient lava flow that created the iconic basalt cliffs of the coulee.

No need to leave the resort to find fun while staying in the on-site cabins or 90 plus tent and RV sites that snug right up to the lake edge, including 12 pull-through sites. Find the essentials you need at the grocery/tackle/bait shop, and even some surprises. Or hang with the kids and family at the picnic and playground areas.

The new owners and friendly staff are able to accommodate large groups, including special events like reunions and weddings. Dogs are welcome for small fee.



The Sun Lakes Park Resort welcomes visitors to one of Washington's favorite family vacation destinations. Conveniently located at the center of the Coulee Corridor within Sun Lakes-Dry Falls State Park on the north shore of Park Lake and just south of Coulee City.

Although located in the state park, this family-owned private resort does not require the Discover Pass for day-use or overnight guests. Overnight guests are given a pass for access to all other parts of the state park.

Enjoy boating in your own or a rented row boat, pedal boat or stand-up paddle board. Golfing is available at the adjacent Vic Meyers Golf Course, or at the on-site mini-golf course. Swim in the beautiful lake waters or the pool. Or, if you're looking for a more exciting water experience, check out the Water Wars station! There is plenty of space throughout the park to bask in the sun and enjoy time with family. While you're there be sure to enjoy the concession stand and gift shop. The resort is open March to October. With an extra charge, pets are allowed in cabins.




Sun Lakes-Dry Falls State Park extends from the south end of Lake Lenore all the way north to Dry Falls. The campground sits at the north end, just north of Park Lake. To reach the park campground, turn east off State Highway 17. Continue down the road passing by the Sun Lakes Park Resort.

To stay at the state park you will need a Discover Pass for both overnight and day use, and cash or credit card is accepted at the pay stations. Challenge yourself to visit all nine lakes or complete all eight hikes throughout the park, including the very popular Umatilla Rock hike that traverses around and/or over the gigantic basalt rock that stands isolated by itself beyond at the bottom of Dry Falls. Deep Lake is a great fishing lake only accessible through the park. Feel free to take it easy while visiting, as well, and enjoy the wildlife and exceptional bird watching.

Reservations can be made on the Washington State Park website, which you'll want to do for discount reservations of the group area that accommodates up to 75 people in tents or for one of the three pull-through sites.

Pets are allowed on-leash. A swimming area is roped off at the beach. Feel like putting on a show? Don't worry, the campground comes equipped with an outdoor amphitheater!



Desert Aire's top rated 18-hole golf course and tennis/pickle ball courts are open to the public. The water playground includes 20 miles of the majestic Columbia River attracting boaters, water skiers, fishermen and fisherwomen and fishing/hunting enthusiasts. The marina access and day park includes a 3.1-mile walking trail managed by Grant PUDs Priest Rapids Recreation Area. Nearby attractions include off road facilities, the Gorge Amphitheater and the Wanapum Heritage Center. Columbia Valley wineries are in any direction inside an hour's drive with several tasting rooms and nearby breweries for the non-wine enthusiasts. There are more activities and sights to discover at the Information Center Kiosk near the main entrance to Desert Aire.




Located on the shore of the north end of Banks Lake close to the town of Electric City, this resort has something for everyone. Its opportune location on the water, near town, and all its amenities make every type of vacation an option.

Of its 58 RV sites, 23 are partial hook-ups and available for tents. Of the full hook-up sites, 18 are pull-through. The vacation rental is a yurt located in the north section of the resort that sits on a shaded platform with a great view of the lake. No pets are allowed in the yurt, but welcome in the rest of the resort.

The owner hopes you'll enjoy the on-site bait and tackle shop where you'll find, "A lotta, lotta, lotta tackle!" With or without your tackle you're able to rent fishing, pontoon, stand-up paddle boards and pedal boards. The boat dock and launch from the resort is popular, as is the short iaunt to great fishing along Banks Lake and recreation on Lake Roosevelt.

If you don't feel like traveling beyond your resort destination, no worries, the resort offers extra amenities like hard serve ice cream, firewood, a large lawn and picnic area and coin-operated laundry. Propane is available for exchange, not refill. The view leaves nothing to be desired! But don't get too comfortable, although it's open all winter sans on-site water, long-term reservations are not an option.

# **10** Osborne Bay Campground


Osborne Bay Campground is on land owned by the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation and managed by Washington State Parks. Though the small state-run campground has no running water or electricity it does offer decent shaded campsites next to Banks Lake. Bring cash, as it is a self-pay system, with an extra fee for use of the boat launch. Day use is also an option, although a Discover Pass is required and can be bought on-site. Any questions or concerns can be directed to the staff at nearby Steamboat Rock State Park.

Turn west from State Highway 155 just north of the Banks Lake Golf & Country Club and south of the bridge south of Electric City. The campground is along a road that borders the course. The campground is nestled on the south shore of the Osborne Bay and Lake, which connects to the north end of Banks Lake.

Although the campground is generally dry, there are large trees that line both rows of camp sites. Between the sites are additional spaces for boats and boat trailers.

All of the 26 sites are available for RVs or tents and there is one ADA accessible site. Sites are first come, first serve basis, and saving sites for friends is discouraged. Feel free to bring your furry friends, however, who are allowed without an extra fee.

There are showers or flushing toilets on-site, but a dump station is nearby at the state-run Northrup Point, a segment of Steamboat Rock State Park.



# **Sunbanks Lake Resort**



Whether visiting Grant County or recreating as a long-time resident, this resort feels like a vacation! Blink and you'll miss the sign, where you head west from State Highway 155, south of a basalt cliff at the south end of Electric City. Check in at the impressive log cabin style office and get your stay kicked off right at the Cantina, with its full-service restaurant and bar or coffee shop.

According to the manager at the front desk, it's a fabulous, amazing, family-friendly resort with a great staff. And, it is safe, with security offered Wednesday through Sunday. Vacation rentals range from dry cabins to five-room villas with kitchen and washer/dryer. Of the RV spaces, 21 are full hook-up and pull-through.

Step outside to lounge in one of the numerous shady or sandy locales on the property. Options include swimming at the beach or sightseeing from the beach, hiking north at Steamboat Rock and/or boating on Banks Lake to the south. Bring a net to utilize the newly constructed playfield, or take a swing at the 18-hole mini golf course. If you want to get on the water, rent a pontoon, jet skis or ski boat at KJ Watersports, the on-site water sport service. Feel free to bring up to two of your four-legged friends, as well, for an extra charge in the villas. Or, head to the Cantina for Karaoke on Friday and live bands Saturday.



# **Jones Bay Campground** Jones Bay Road off State Highway 155 N




Jones Bay Campground is on land owned by the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation though it is managed by Washington State Parks. This is a small state-run campground that offers primitive sites with no water or electricity. It is a self-pay system. Day use is an option, although a Discover Pass is required, as it is for overnight guests, and can be bought on-site. Any guestions or concerns can be directed to Steamboat State Park, who manages the campground.

Exit west off State Highway 155 north of Northrup Point and south of Osborne Bay Campground. Follow the road signs. The campground meanders along the north side of Jones Bay on the Banks Lake shoreline, offering sites under trees and on the beach. For campers looking for a secluded getaway, there are three hike-in only spots at the far end, with parking at the sites' trailhead. The campground is arranged into sections. Jones Bay South has sites 1-18 while Jones Bay North has an additional 26 sites (19-44).

Although there is no boat launch, there are some secluded beach areas where you can put kayaks or innertubes in for a nice lake float in the secluded bay. Boat launches are located up and down the road if you're hoping to explore more of Banks Lake, as is a dump station south down the road at Northrup Point (N Milepost 19).

The 44 sites are best suited for tents, although there are a handful that RVs could fit into. Pets are welcome at no extra fee.

# **12** Steamboat Rock State Park

This expansive state park is wedged between the foot of Steamboat Rock and Devils Punch Bowl at the north end of Banks Lake. The park's namesake is an 800 foot basalt lava monolith in the shape of an old time steamboat in the cradle of the cliffs.


You can, however, miss out on getting a site if you don't reserve during the park's peak season, May 15 to September 15. Reservations can be made on the Washington State Parks website and a Discover Pass is required.

To avoid crowds, consider the shoulder seasons, or even winter time, as the park is open year round. Although it is open in the winter, water is not available at tent or RV sites. Spring is a fantastic time to see the wildflowers on Steamboat Rock.

The park boasts volleyball and basketball courts, and several trailheads for hiking, including up to the top of Steamboat Rock and to the nearby Northrup Canyon where you'll see rare Grant County native pine trees.

All RV sites are full hook-up while 10 are pull-through. The sites are grouped together in several areas, some green grassy, shady sites and others more desert-like with scattered trees.

Although there is no grocery store, there is a concession stand open during the summer months. Pets are allowed though there is an additional fee for cabin rentals. ADA accessible sites are available.



Oasis Park is north of State Highway 28 on the west edge of Ephrata. It lies in an area that receives 6-9 inches of annual rainfall so it technically lies in a desert climate even though with the introduction of the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project in the 1950s, water became much more abundant. The park was created in 1974 when funding was secured by the city of Ephrata to make it happen and the venue is still owned and operated by the city. It has a fishing pond stocked with trout, bass and catfish, golf courses, hiking trails, enormous shade trees, and other amenities. Visitors can stay in the campground and participate in park activities. Day users can come into the park and use the 9-hole golf course, mini golf, fish, hike, or picnic on the grounds.

The local Lions Club holds an annual fishing derby in the park. There is a lot to see and do nearby by traveling to the Columbia River to the west, into the Beezley Hills to the north, through the Columbia Basin and into the Grand Coulee. Visitors and locals may check out the geology and history of the area and learn about the thousands of Columbia Basin Irrigation Project features that are superimposed on our landscape. In 1976, the park acquired pieces of the old United Methodist Church of Ephrata which was being torn down to make way for a new facility. Parts of the church were reassembled and it has been used since then as a chapel. It retains some of its old charm and history and though it seems out of place partially hidden in the trees, it is worth seeing.




# **15** Sun Basin RV Resort

Though the park and campground are tiny, the grounds are well cared for and neat. The park is very visible from Interstate 90 where it is situated just northeast of the Winchester Rest Area along north side of the Frontage Road. The south side of the resort entry is bordered with a decorative fence. Well-established pine and willow windbreaks border the west and east sides and the grounds have several small pines and other young trees. Along the two rows of RV spaces, there are taller shade trees. Lawns occur around the perimeter of the park which covers approximately 17 acres total.

The park is 17 miles south of Ephrata and 17 miles west of Moses Lake. It is approximately 20 miles west to the Gorge Amphitheatre at George. There are many places nearby where there is fishing, boating, hiking, biking,






# **16** Ephrata RV Park & Campground 5707 State Hwy 28 W

Located west of State Highway 28 the newly renamed Ephrata RV Park and Campground was formerly called Sunnysprings. Ownership changed in June 2020 and the resort is being upgraded under new management. It has some interesting features that are being resurrected to give it more appeal. Some of the willows in the tent camping area on the common lawn area were removed and plans are to replant and/or convert the affected area to short stay accommodations. The restrooms were repainted and the grounds are receiving more daily attention to detail. There is a swimming pool and even a full-length driving range for golfers, which will be available for day users once it is refurbished. The resort lies between Quincy and Ephrata and seems to appeal mostly to longer term residents who work in the area but has enough space to accommodate overnight travelers and tent campers. Besides RV and tent spaces, there are 10 small cabins. Most of the spaces have shade trees and since the "resort" is several hundred feet off the highway, it feels like a quiet place to rest.





# 17 Gorge Amphitheatre Campgrounds and RVing

The Gorge Campground is open for concerts and other events held at the Gorge Amphitheatre. In addition to the vehicle camping pass, a valid event ticket is required to enter the campgrounds. There are several camping options to consider which range from standard camping sites, safari tents, RV sites (standard and big rigs), and even deluxe so called "glamping" with tent cottages, private restrooms, showers, complimentary coffee and pastries, and power. The premier and terrace options offer free shuttle service to the amphitheater concerts.

The Gorge Campground is connected to the Gorge Amphitheatre by a trail that runs about 500 yards between the two venues. There is room for over 6200 vehicles in the campgrounds with other deluxe camping options available.

The venue is in a unique setting with spectacular views of the Columbia River gorge, the Colockum range and farmlands connected with the Columbia Basin to the north, east, west, and south.

Whether you want to be in the heart of the action or looking for something more secluded, we have the perfect spot for you to get the most out of your experience at The Gorge Amphitheatre.




Perched at the top of the Grand Coulee and the north end of Grant County, this park is the northern most point to stay in the region. Not only north, it is quite literally perched above the town of Grant Coulee, above the Grand Coulee Dam and above Roosevelt and Banks Lake. The park consists of several levels cut into the side of the basalt cliffs, clustered among electric towers that bring power directly to your site.

The park seems to be a quiet community of retired and out-of-country visitors. More than quiet, it is clean and secure. After a long day at the dam, in town, or on the lake, return to the park to enjoy the shady and grassy picnic area.

Reservations are available for groups for and year-round use. All RV sites are full hook-up, and all but three are pull-through. Tent sites are located in a group lawn setting. Although pets are allowed at no extra charge, no pit bulls or Rottweilers are allowed, and no dogs are allowed in the tent area.

The park is close to grocery and convenience stores, so any amenities not offered on-site are easily accessed. It is also a short commute to any tourist-related activity in the area.




Located at the north end of the town of Grand Coulee, this is a great option for easy access to the Grand Coulee Dam. RV sites are across the street from the office in the grass and shade. Apartments and Park Model vacation rentals are in the lot behind the office.

The park is open year- round, but call ahead to reserve one of the five pull-through sites. This mellow, slow-paced park is perfect for the retired crowd looking to pull-in, stay a while and explore the region. In keeping with the quiet nature of the place, only two dogs allowed per site.

As it is nestled right in town, visitors have access to grocery stores, ice, picnic and playgrounds, even if amenities are not on-site. The dam and visitor center are only a few miles away, as are several great spots to watch the summer-time dam laser-light show.

Interested in architecture? See the journey of Moses Lake architect Robert Hull's career. His achievements include designing the Grand Coulee Dam Visitor Center, to one of the last projects he oversaw (before passing) which was the Civic Center in Moses Lake.




# 20 Priest Rapids Recreation Area Campground

To reach this park, drive 4 miles south of Mattawa on State Highway 243 and turn west into Desert Aire following the road through a residential area 1.4 miles to turn left (west) into the recreation area. There are 14 dry sites (no water/sewer/electricity) but there is ample shade from pine trees and poplars. Each campsite and picnic areas have well maintained green lawn and the turf is irrigated. There are also a 3-lane boat launch with docks, a 3.1 mile trail with views of the Columbia River waterfront, covered picnic areas and barbeques, a swimming beach, fish cleaning table, interpretation and education signs and vault toilets. There are fees for camping though the area is open year-round and visitors can reserve campsites for the peak season, March 1 – September 30. The recreational area is owned and managed by the Grant County PUD (Public Utility District).



About 8 miles south of the town of Mattawa, 2.4 miles south of Priest Rapids Dam on State Highway 243 or 6 miles west of the Vernita Bridge crossing of the Columbia River, is the entrance to Jackson Creek Fish Camp. Turn west and drive another .6 miles on a wide gravel road to the camp. There is a paved path to the shoreline though there are also several clearly marked trails to access the shoreline in various places. Be prepared for no shade at the picnic or campground. There are 10 dry campsites (no water/sewer/electricity) accessible by vehicle (2 are ADA accessible). The camp is very exposed and it could be quite inhospitable in the heat of the summer though much more tolerable other times of the year. There are no trees and the area has typical native shrub-steppe habitat and dominated by bitterbrush, sagebrush, buckwheat, and grasses. Along the Columbia River, there are well established stands of woody riparian vegetation. Views of Umtanum Ridge to the southwest are impressive as is the river in this part of the Hanford Reach. Currents along the river are quite swift and there are signs stating the dangers of entering the waters.



Formerly called Perch Point Resort, Sandy Point may be small and quaint but it is situated on a prominent viewing location. It lies on the end of a point overlooking Potholes Reservoir with a variety of interesting perspectives looking up and down the reservoir and to the southwest across the water to Mardon Resort. RV overnighters are allowed, space available, though tents are not. However, there are also two vacation rental trailers. The park is officially open April 1 — October 31 though the opening and closing dates are flexible.

The point lies above land owned by the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation and managed by the Washington Department of Fish & Wildlife so that access to the shoreline requires a Discover Pass. Long time visitors to the area may know the shoreline as Medicare Beach and maps show the Medicare Beach Access Road to the shoreline. The name originated from a time in the 1960s or before when retirees used to bring their RVs and camp right along the shoreline. The area is well used by fisherman, walkers, ORVs and boaters.





Cascade Park is owned and operated by the city of Moses Lake Parks & Recreation Department. Access to Moses Lake and its associated water sports are premier attractions as well as the wide-open spaces occupied by the well-maintained lawns and playing areas. Cascade Park covers 30 acres and lies adjacent to the Dr. Leiv Kvamme Soccer Complex which has youth and adult soccer fields and seasonal t-ball fields. Both the park and soccer complex lie along the Moses Lake waterfront and shoreline with its associated recreational activities (fishing, boating, mooring docks, swimming, walking, picnic shelters, and day use areas). All campground spaces have lake views and there is lots of open space in the spacious well-groomed lawns, picnic shelters, playgrounds, and fields. The campground is open April-September.





The Grant County Fairgrounds in Moses Lake is often described as the "showplace of event planning" in the county. Potholes State Park is a 640-acre camping park with 6,000 feet of freshwater shoreline on Potholes Reservoir, also known as O'Sullivan Reservoir. Potholes Reservoir is often confused with the pothole lakes themselves, which can be a 30 to 45-minute drive from the park. The terrain is desert with freshwater marshes. The park provides two picnic shelters with two tables each, plus 73 unsheltered picnic tables in a lawned, well-shaded area. All day-use facilities are first-come, first-served. Restrooms are available in the day-use area, located on the banks of the reservoir.

The park has 61 tent spaces, 60 utility spaces, one dump station, four restrooms (two ADA) and four showers (two ADA). Any camping unit tent or RV may use either site type. However, any unit camped in a hookup site must pay the hookup-site fee. Maximum site length is 50 feet (may have limited availability). There is no camping next to the reservoir. Four boat ramps and 100 feet of dock are provided by the park. Water levels in O'Sullivan Reservoir (Potholes Reservoir) fluctuate dramatically from spring to fall. A daily permit is available for watercraft launching, vehicle parking and there is a charge for trailer dumping at the park. Annual permits also may be purchased at Washington State Parks Headquarters in Olympia, at regional offices, online, and at parks when staff is available. A Discover Pass is required for day or overnight use in the park.

Located on the east shore of Soap Lake, the City of Soap Lake owned campground is right off State Highway 17 in the (city) park by the lake. There are several features within walking distance of the campground. The campground is situated north of the Soap Lake Visitor Center, adjacent to the Calling the Healing Waters bronze sculpture and a new community kiosk. Trees on-site are small though the real beauty is the wonderful views of the lake and the surrounding dark colored basalt cliffs. 
